# **Municipal Election Issue**



Dark money organizations are targeting public schools and public libraries throughout Illinois. It is important to make careful, informed choices in the April 4th election. These extremist groups conduct training seminars on how to run for board elections and how to get books banned from libraries. They seek to discredit public institutions and impose their harmful views on our communities. Among other things, they advocate banning of LGBTQUI-inclusive books from school and public libraries and are against diversity, equity, and SEL initiatives.

Public libraries are especially vulnerable, as exemplified by the harm done to the award-winning Niles-Maine Public Library after the April 2021 election. Low voter turnout resulted in the election of extremist trustees who reduced services and cut staffing. It is time to vote them out! Local 1274 has endorsed the Reclaim our Library slate.
