Seeking equity and social justice in our communities is one of the prime directives of Local 1274. Here are some excellent upcoming opportunities coordinated by our hardworking Equity Chairs:

#### SEED (Seeking Educational Equity and Diversity)

SEED application with the meeting time and dates

For the second year, NSTU is hosting SEED equity training. SEED is a peer-facilitated seminar that allows individuals to engage in structured conversations on equity and diversity. These conversations will include the sharing of personal stories and outside resources. The goal is to illuminate ways to bring justice and equity to our organizations. You will explore, discuss, and share experiences with aspects of identity including race, gender, class, and sexual orientation.

Applications are open until Sept. 9th. Any NSTU member is welcome to sign up for this training which will bring together members from across Local 1274. Participants earn 30 hours of professional development credit towards certificate renewal..

#### SEED II

#### SEED II application with the meeting time and dates

Inspired by the SPROUT seminar created in Evanston/ Skokie School District 65, SEED II provides participants with structured conversations on equity, while focusing on creating projects that put into action the skills learned in SEED. Participants must have completed a SEED seminar to be eligible to participate in SEED II.

<u>Applications</u> are open until Sept. 9th. Participants earn 30 hours of professional development credit towards certificate renewal.

#### NTFTSS District 219: Olga Shafran

Olga Shafron is a math teacher at Niles West and a Skokie resident and parent. Olga and her colleagues created <u>Ukraine TrustChain</u>, an organization dedicated to help those displaced by the war in Ukraine. The money goes directly to teams providing aid on the ground, who respond dynamically to the most urgent needs. Olga and Ukraine TrustChain have been nominated for an AFT Drum Major for Justice Award for their work on behalf of human rights.

#### Fairview South School District 72

In May, Fairview 7th/8th Grade Science teacher and FTA Member Jenny Che coordinated a fundraiser project as part of her Conservation unit. After introducing her students to the Saving Penguins initiative (savingpenguins.org), she worked with 7th grade students to create penguin-themed trinkets (keychains, necklaces, etc.) with 3D printers, and sold the items to raise money from the community. This involved planning student presentations to K-4 classrooms, and preparing materials to educate the community about the initiative. While Jenny initially projected that the effort would raise around \$100, the project ended up raising around \$2600!

As a capstone for the project, Jenny coordinated a Zoom call with the coordinator of the project, Kevin Graham (the lead researcher in this film), that was held in the auditorium with all 7th graders. In all, Fairview students raised enough money to build 77 penguin nests which would serve up to 1136 penguins over the life of nests. This story was also covered by local radio station WBBM!

## Senator Villivalam Visits the NSTU Exec Board

Illinois 8th district senator Ram Villivalam visited the Local 1274 Executive Board meeting with an update from the legislative session that ended in April. Sen. Villivalam told us he has "a strong commitment to working families in my district and to fighting for them in Springfield." This is his second visit to the NSTU executive board. He has been incredibly supportive of school employees and their unions.

One of the biggest legislative session wins for our schools is the passage of <u>SB 3986</u>, which strongly limits the standardized testing of students in pre-K through second grade. IFT has fought hard against the ISBE proposal to unnecessarily test our youngest students.
